PSYCHOLOGY

The Psychology Bachelor program is designed to teach students about the brain, human behavior and social interactions through scientific approaches. Courses in psychology cover a wide range of topics such as mental health, forensic psychology and developmental psychology. Students acquire an understanding about the ethics of psychology in regard to interaction with clients.

Entry Qualifications

1. Senior High School completion or higher
2. Proof of work experience, used for evaluation and approval by the school authorities for entry qualification.

School Hours That Meet Your Time Schedule

In accordance with regulations governing classroom attendance, classes can be planned and scheduled on weekends and National Holidays as not to interfere with student regular working hours.

Further Education application requirements and procedures:

1. Completion of application form
2. Presentation of documents of previous educational achievement (transcripts)
3. After completion of formal school registration, student identity card will be issued

Future prospects:

Students who complete a B.S. in Psychology may pursue entry-level positions in psychology-related careers. Individuals may find work in mental health facilities, halfway houses, crisis center hospitals, detention centers or psychiatric hospitals. Some graduates may find positions as psychiatric assistants, assistant directors or administrators.
