Degree Overview

Flexible course completion:

1. Choice of international curriculum planning, divided into courses taught in Taiwan or in our affiliated overseas institutions in full or part. All classes can be completed in Taiwan with a quick 2 year 8 month completion.

Entry Qualifications

1. Senior High School completion or higher
2. Proof of work experience, used for evaluation and approval by the school authorities for entry qualification.

School Hours That Meet Your Time Schedule

In accordance with regulations governing classroom attendance, classes can be planned and scheduled on weekends and National Holidays as not to interfere with student regular working hours.

Further Education application requirements and procedures:

1. Completion of application form
2. Presentation of documents of previous educational achievement (transcripts)

Future prospects:

The Bachelor of Traditional Chinese Medicine degree course provides graduates with a professional entry level for the practice of acupuncture and Chinese herbal medicine. It provides a thorough grounding in the theory of natural medicine. Students complete clinical hours, starting in the first semester and are well equipped for private practice upon graduation. Opportunities exist in healthcare policy development and consultancy; research trial coordination; and sales, marketing and product development for herbal and pharmaceutical companies in addition to the self employment in private practice or as part of a clinical tea.
