A Master degree in Leisure Services prepares emerging leaders to examine and create solutions which ensure that residents and travelers alike can enjoy recreational experiences, natural and cultural amenities, heritage resources, and adventure as part of their life experiences on a sustainable basis. Students engage in coursework delivered in a non–traditional, international educational setting where the instructional approach draws upon field experience, classroom instruction, and experiential styles of learning. During completion of the program, students will acquire a broad interdisciplinary knowledge of concepts, models and issues relating to the field of leisure services, analyze sustainability issues by integrating social, environmental and economic perspectives develop and critique policies and practices that advance sustainability goals conduct applied research on specific leisure, innovation, and sustainability topics

- 2. Proof of work experience, used for evaluation and approval by the school authorities for entry qualification.
