The Master Social Work Degree leads to a professional and academic discipline to the improvement of the quality of life and well-being of an individual, group or community by intervening through research, policy, community organizing, direct practice and teaching on behalf of those afflicted with poverty or any real or perceived social injustices and violations of human rights. Study is focused on human development, social policy and public administration and development. This program includes theories from economics, education, sociology, medicine, philosophy, politics and psychology.

## **Entry Qualifications**

- 1. Bachelor Degree Completion
- 2. Proof of work experience, used for evaluation and approval by the school authorities for entry qualification.

#### **School Hours That Meet Your Time Schedule**

In accordance with regulations governing classroom attendance, classes can be planned and scheduled on weekends and National Holidays as not to interfere with student regular working hours.

#### **Future Prospects:**

Most social workers generally work within their master's specialty area. Social workers who specialize in social advocacy may work as public advocates, fundraisers or counselors with local nonprofit agencies or in national legislative offices.

Children and family services social workers might practice privately or work for community-based organizations. Mental health social workers help individuals, families and groups cope with psychological and interpersonal problems that affect healthy functioning, including substance abuse or other emotionally-related conditions. Healthcare social workers are employed by hospitals, clinics, home health care organizations and nursing homes to counsel patients dealing with chronic disease and disabilities.
